



Ralph L. Lloyd, Jr.

September 2, 1936 - December 20, 2014

Ralph L. Lloyd, Jr., 78, of Carrollton passed away peacefully on December 20, 2014. Born in Uniontown, PA on September 2, 1936, he was the son of Ralph L. Lloyd, Sr. and Ena (Coldren) Lloyd. He graduated from Uniontown High School in 1954 and was honorably discharged from the Army in 1957 after three years of service. In 1962 he graduated from Waynesburg College. He accepted a position at Carrollton High School where he taught for thirty years before retiring in 1991. He was assistant wrestling coach under Rusty Bright for a number of years and has twice entered the Carrollton Sports Hall of Fame with the teams of 1967 and 1972. Ralph's desire to serve his community led him to become a member of the Carrollton Village Fire Department, where he served for 43 years, eventually rising to assistant chief. In addition, he was a paramedic and served for a time as Carroll County Emergency Management Director and on the Ohio Emergency Response Commission. He was a member of the Carrollton First United Methodist Church where he sang in the Chancel Choir for many years. He was also a member of the Ohio Fire Chiefs Association. In addition to his wife, Ann, he is survived by a son, Steven R. (Kimary) Lloyd; daughter, Barbara J. (Marvin) Adams; two grandchildren, Audra and Amanda Adams; and two nephews, Rob Martz and John Hooper. He was preceded in death by his parents and sister, Kathryn. A simple service will be held at Dodds Funeral Home at 12 noon on Friday, December 26, 2014 with Rev. Dan Loomis officiating.
