



George E.M. (Bud) Smith

George E. M. (Bud) Smith, 94, of Carrollton died early Saturday morning May 18, 2013. He was born September 17, 1918 in Steubenville, Ohio. He was a son of the late Benjamin H.T. and Mary HULLIHEN Smith. He was WWII Navy veteran. Bud was an entrepreneur in the Carrollton area having owned several businesses and retiring as a salesman for Huebner Chevrolet in Carrollton. An avid golfer for many years, Bud was twice able to score "a hole in one". Once while in his eighties and once while in his nineties. Bud was a member of the First United Methodist of Carrollton, The Carrollton Masonic Lodge #124, and the Carroll County Vets Club.
