George J. Timko Jr., 87, of East Springfield and Amsterdam, died Tuesday morning, November 2, 2021 at the Lancia Vista Care Center in Steubenville, Ohio.

Born on June 23, 1934 in Rankin, Pennsylvania, he was a son of the late George and Mary Smerzik Timko Sr.
