



Glenn T. Speedy

November 1, 1939 - May 27, 2010

Glenn T. Speedy, 70, of Zanesville, formerly of Carrollton, passed away peacefully at the home of his son in Carrollton on May 27, 2010, following a courageous battle with lung cancer. Glenn was born November 1, 1939 in Bradford, Pennsylvania to Mary (Patterson) Speedy and the late Ben Speedy. His younger brother, Roy Speedy, preceded him on death on January 18, 1942. Glenn is survived by his mother, Mary Speedy of Carrollton; his brothers, Rex (Nelda) Speedy of Broken Arrow, Oklahoma and Jack (Karen) Speedy of Carrollton; his son, Sean (Michelle) Speedy of Carrollton; his daughter, Kelly (Speedy) Vigne-Lee of Montana; and two grandsons, Ryan and Danny. He was a 1957 graduate of Otto Township High School and a 1962 graduate of Clarion State Teachers College. Glenn taught for two years at Trafford High School before moving to Evansville, Indiana where he worked for Calgon Corp. He then moved to Charleston, West Virginia to work for Halliburton as an Engineer in the oil and gas industry. For a short time, he worked in Warren, Pennsylvania for NE Natural Gas Company as a field/production engineer. Before moving to Carrollton, Ohio, he worked with his father and brother drilling water wells. In 1981, he moved to Zanesville, Ohio to work as a District Engineer for Universal Well Services. In 1986, he bought his own tools and finished the remainder of his life drilling water wells. He completed his last well in September of 2009. He was a member of the Jackson Masonic Lodge 85 in Brownsville, Ohio and a member of the Loyal Order of Moose Lodge 867, Zanesville, Ohio. He enjoyed sharing meals with

his friends at the Moose Lodge. He was an avid golfer and enjoyed playing golf with his Friday night golf league. Glenn was a very generous man, always giving of his time and self to others. A memorial service will be held on Saturday, August 7, 2010 at 11:00 a.m. at the Carrollton First United Methodist Church with Rev. Dan Loomis officiating.
