Harry L. Cubberley Jr., 86, of Carrollton went home to be with the Lord early Thursday morning February 5, 2009 in Aultman Hospital of Canton. A son of the late Harry L. Sr. and Annie (Bartleman) Cubberley, he was born July 6, 1922 in Morrisville, Pennsylvania. Harry was a World War II veteran having served under General Patton. He was a building contractor and had a saw sharpening business. He was a devoted follower of Jesus Christ, a careful student and teacher of the Bible, and a member of the Carrollton Bible Chapel. He never tired of telling people, "God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son." (John 3:16) .
