Joseph Ellison Schier, 73, of Carrollton, Ohio passed away following a brief illness on September 25, 2022, with his family by his side.

He was born in Chesterfield, SC to Harry and Myrtle Schier on August 1, 1949. After graduating from Chesterfield High School, he moved to Ohio in 1967. Joe enlisted in the U.S. Army in 1968 and served as a Military Police Officer in Vietnam, earning several commendations and campaign ribbons. He worked for Reed Trucking and retired from TimkenSteel, as a Refiner, after 26 years.

Joe loved spending time with his grandchildren, taking them on tractor rides, making smores by the fire, playing baseball, and shooting targets. He also enjoyed his garden, growing cucumbers, peppers, and tomatoes, as well as cultivating irises. As a tractor enthusiast, he could always find some work to be done on his Massey Ferguson 135. Joe was a member of the 504th Military Police Battalion Association and a lifetime member of the VFW Post 3301. He was an active member of the First United Methodist Church.

Joe is survived by his loving wife of 48 years, Darlene (Baker), as well as their daughter, Lindy (Allen) Hylton, and son Ryan Schier.
