



## Norma Lee (Scott) Grunder

November 18, 1934 - March 10, 2012

Norma Lee (Scott) Grunder, 77, of Carrollton, Ohio, passed away on March 10 after an extended illness. Norma was born in Canton, Ohio on November 18, 1934. She was preceded in death by her parents, Dwight and Golda (Donaldson) Scott of New Harrisburg, and her husband, Charles R. Grunder. A life-long resident of Carroll County, Norma attended school in New Harrisburg and graduated from Carrollton High School in 1952. She worked as a waitress at the Hilltop Restaurant before becoming a switchboard operator for General Telephone in Carrollton, a job she left after marrying Charles Grunder in 1954. In 1961 Norma and Charles moved to the family farm north of Carrollton and managed their dairy farm through the 1990s. In the 1980s Norma began working as a babysitter and continued caring for children of friends and family for much of the remainder of her life. Norma is survived by her siblings, twin sister, Nancy Buckridge of New Harrisburg, Kenneth Scott of Carrollton, and Ralph Scott of Myrtle Beach; children, Jeff Grunder and Jim Grunder of Carrollton, Scott Grunder of Cincinnati, Dan (Amber) Grunder of Harlem Springs, and Kathy (Patrick) Brown of Minerva; grandchildren, Ashleigh Johnson, Rebecca Grunder, and Amanda Mae, Derek and Travis Brown; and extended family, Bridgette and Allison Campbell, Sarah, Shelly, and Sally Schmactenberger, Curtis Moyer, and Maci and Harli Ulman; three cousins, and many well loved nieces and nephews. Norma attended the Presbyterian Church of New Harrisburg as a child and as a member of the First Presbyterian Church of Carrollton. Funeral services will

be Friday, March 16, at 11 a.m. in Sweeney-Dodds Funeral Home of Carrollton. Visitation will be Thursday from 5-7 p.m. and Friday from 10 a.m. until time of service.
