Richard Eugene Powell, 92, of Carrollton, passed away on Friday, November 5, 2021 at Mercy Medical Center in Canton, Ohio.

A son of the late Thomas J. and Clara Brunner Powell, he was born on August 14, 1929 in Canal Fulton, Ohio.

Richard was a United States Navy Veteran, proudly serving two tours in the Korean war, and was a member of the National Rifle Association. He was also an avid deer hunter, loved being outside, feeding the birds and loved riding around on his 4-wheeler and golf cart. His family remembers how much he enjoyed going to Ponderosa every Sunday and how all the staff made him feel like a king.

He is survived by two daughters; Jerri Stimmel and Clarissa (Scott) Ray; 16 grandchildren; 13 great grandchildren; and five great-great grandchildren. Along with his parents, Richard was preceded in death by his wife Jo Ann Swisher Powell in 2009; daughters, Michelle Powell and Jolee Getz; son Michael Powell; and brother Bob (Ruby) Powell.

A memorial service will be held at 1:00 p.m. on Saturday, November 13, 2021 at Dodds Funeral Home in Carrollton with military honors.
