Richard "Dick" W. Ricer, 79, of Harlem Springs, went to be home with his Lord and Savior on Tuesday, January 31, 2023.

A son of the late Raymond and M. Isabelle (Stucky) Ricer, he was born on September 17, 1943, in Dover, Ohio.

During his life, Dick was a member of the Harsh Memorial United Methodist Church, and also attended Kilgore United Methodist Church. He was a member of the Tuscarawas County Masonic Lodge #59, and a former Grange member of 25 years. Dick loved farming his hay fields and worked as a surface miner, being skilled in operating all types of heavy equipment, however his passion was for running drag lines.
