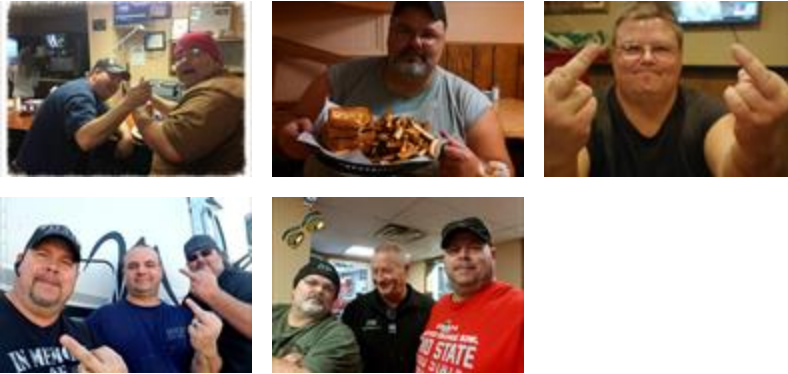
There will be no memorial services held.

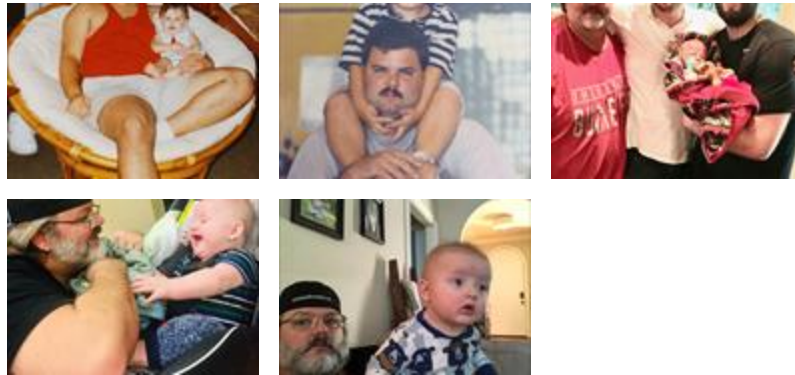

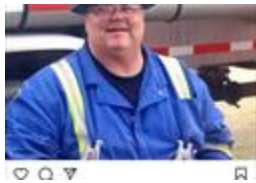
